

# TOP 10 RISK MANAGEMENT TIPS FOR CHURCH PLANTERS

1. **Create Policies To Protect:** Church planters often host activities to generate excitement, which can come with some risk. Having policies and procedures in place — such as facility use agreements and participant agreements — is a vital risk management tool that clearly outlines who bears responsibility in each situation.
2. **Be Prepared for Accidents:** They happen even in small churches. A general liability policy is a must to protect against bodily injury claims and shows your commitment to do the right thing.
3. **Care for the Children:** Policies and procedures to protect children are a must. Learn the risks and assure that every worker submits an application and undergoes a screening that includes background checks. Train your workers and establish the two-adult rule for all interactions with children.
4. **Protect Your Lay Leaders:** Your elders, deacons and trustees risk their own assets and reputation to serve the church. Protect them directors' and officers' liability coverage.
5. **Cover Your Rented Building:** If you rent a building for services and modify it, you need leasehold/tenants' improvements coverage to recoup your improvement costs in case of a loss. Also, consider coverage for items kept at a rented facility or maintained elsewhere and transported during the week.
6. **Defend Your People:** Understand your basic policy regarding the defense of employees and volunteers. You may want to provide additional coverage to protect your people.
7. **Worship Safely in Homes:** House churches present risks to both the homeowners and your ministry. Ask yourself: "If someone got hurt here today, who is responsible for that?"
8. **Be Road Ready:** Volunteers often drive their personal vehicles for church events. Buying non-owned auto insurance is an inexpensive way to protect your ministry.
9. **Guard Your Online Presence:** Cybersecurity is an issue churches must manage, too. Use reliable software to protect yourself and adopt policies and procedures to guide you in handling a data breach.
10. **Partner With an Expert:** Talk to Christian insurance experts about what you do and let them guide you. There are church-specific and inexpensive policies for church planters that provide excellent coverage solutions and great peace of mind as you grow.
